

WORLD SICKLE CELL DAY WEDNESDAY JUNE 19TH 2024



We will be celebrating world sickle cell day on the 19th June 2024.

Sickle cell disease is a group of conditions in which <u>red blood cells</u> are not shaped as they should be. Red blood cells normally look like round discs. But in sickle cell disease, they're shaped like sickles, or crescent moons, instead.

A member of our school family who has Sickle Cell Disease will be leading a presentation to commemorate this day. This will give all of us information, raise awareness and allow this member of our community and their family to share their own life experience of living with this condition. All are welcome to join for this presentation at 9am in the school hall.
