Dear Parents and Carers,

On Monday, our Catholic life leaders led our Gospel assembly about the parable of the Mustard Seed and told us how small things can lead to big things, so we should never underestimate the smallest of actions. Sometimes we have to start small to go big and at St. Mark's we love to go big on our Catholic Social Teaching Principles. We have a moral duty to do the right thing at the right time and this was emphasised at the SJBCA Sustainability Summit that our Year 5 and 6 children attended yesterday.

This was the first Sustainability Summit that we have attended, and it was a real honour to be there yesterday as part of the SJBCA family, learning more about the UN goals. We must respond to the call to action to end poverty, protect the planet, and ensure that by 2030 all people enjoy peace and prosperity. This is an ambitious target, but our family of schools showed us yesterday how small changes can make a big difference.

Our children stood up on stage and presented their learning and how they have put their faith into action in front of hundreds of other pupils. They presented to a panel of people, including the Mayor of Dudley and the Lord Mayor of Birmingham! Their confidence to articulate the importance of climate action was impressive and they answered a number of questions from the audience on how they will further develop our school's work on climate action over the next twelve months and beyond. Well done to everyone involved with yesterday's summit!

I have enjoyed watching the children practise for Sports Day on Tuesday, not least for their sporting talent and hard work but for their encouragement and support for each other. There was a real sense and show of solidarity. Well done too to the children who visited Edgbaston Cricket Ground on Wednesday, you represented our school brilliantly and also to the children that took part in the Gymnastics festival today at Earls Gymnastics Centre in Oldbury.
