
'Lend a hand, take a stand and STOP BULLYING NOW!'

This year we are participating in Cycle to School Week - encouraging as many children as possible to cycle to and from school each day!

If you are able to participate, bikes can be locked to the bike rack (by the prayer garden) in the morning and then ridden home at the end of the day. The area is more secure now with our new gates and also the area is covered by our school CCTV.

Bike Ability 2024!

In October, we'll be working with BikeAbility to provide cycle training for Y3 - Y6.



Bikeability cycle training equips children with vital life skills. Pupils not only learn to cycle, they gain independence, social skills and a sense of wellbeing.

After Bikeability, children are better at responding to risk and report increased confidence. As a result, more children cycle to school which in turn improves mental health and wellbeing. This allows children to get more out of the classroom, improving their attention span and engagement. Healthier habits lead to increased attendance and improved academic results. Bikeability goes beyond a training course; it impacts children's lives.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS!

Mrs. Hussain and Mrs. Linley are the attendance champions for St. Mark's. This week, you will have received a whole school letter explaining the importance of good attendance. In particular the new national penalty notice framework which came into force on the 19th August 2024. Penalty notice amounts have increased and there is now an escalation process for repeated offences.





We want EVERY child to have good attendance in school because poor attendance can impact significantly on a child's life and development. For this reason, we do not just look at absence rates, we also review attendance and punctuality to identify patterns. Punctuality is just as important as attendance and the following process of support to help your child to thrive in school will be applied:

- 1. Monitor and review attendance and punctuality.
- 2. Meeting with parents to identify how we can improve attendance / punctuality.
- 3. Facilitate support (further support in school may be needed or support from other agencies may be required also.
- 4. Formalise support (only if no or little improvement is made).
- 5. Where all other avenues have been exhausted and support is not working or not being engaged with, attendance will be enforced through statutory intervention or prosecution to protect the pupil's right to an education.

Can all parents please ensure they have downloaded the Arbor app to gain access to the Parent Portal.

The Parent app can be downloaded from either the Playstore on android phones or App store on I-phones.

We have started adding payment items on Arbor, and therefore require all parents to create an account as soon as possible, to ensure they are able to make payments for meals, clubs, trips and toast.

If you experience any difficulties in creating an account, or require any assistance, please contact Mrs Hussain in the school office, who would be more than happy to help.

New Electric Gates

Last week we saw the completion of our new electric gates. This was a huge part of our work to ensure children's safety when in and around school. If you wish to access the main office, and the pedestrian gate is not open, please press the alarm button. A member of school staff will then open the gate.

It is vital that you do not push or pull the gate as this will break the mechanism.

The school car park is only to be used by school staff and <u>MUST NOT</u> be used by parents. It is important that parents <u>DO NOT</u> block the gates at any time, even after the school day has finished. We do have improved security cameras on the gates and car park and this will be monitored closely.

Thank you for your cooperation with prioritising the children's safety.
