My Happy Minds

At St. Mark's we value or our Mental Health and ensure that it is seen as a priority for all. We teach the children how important our Mental Health is and how to look after it

This term, all of the children have been having weekly My Happy Mind lessons.

My Happy Minds is a resource used to teach children preventative habits that support positive mental health, resilience and self esteem.

This term we have focused on the unit "Meet Your Brain", where we have learnt: The different parts of our brain and how they help us. How to use Happy Breathing to help us when we feel sad, stressed or worried. What happens in our brain when we learn something new and how we can look after our brain.

We were also introduced to Team H-A-P.

As we have progressed through the season of Advent, the children have had many opportunities to reflect on the importance of "Staying Awake" and being ready to welcome our Lord, Jesus Christ, when He comes again; also, in sharing the joy of His first coming as a baby born in a stable in Bethlehem.

Children have planned, prepared and delivered Advent liturgies of their own, showing an increasing confidence in choosing items for their prayer focus, suitable music and appropriate scripture to support the theme, and then ensuring that their classmates engage in activities which help them to reflect well on what has been heard.





As I have observed these liturgies across the school, it was a joy to hear children volunteering to offer open prayers for their families, the school, the community and the wider world, particularly when they remembered those who may not be in a position to enjoy Christmas this year.

It was joyful, too, when all of our Key Stage 2 classes (Y3-6) joined with their counterparts across our MAC family of schools in the third annual MAC Carol Concert. We had the honour of opening the concert with a beautifully song rendition of "Love Shone Down"; we were very proud of how well they listened to the other schools' contributions, too!



The children have certainly been well prepared to welcome Jesus again into their hearts this Christmas, and we look forward to deepening their understanding of the season of Christmas when we return in January.
