This marks the first-time pupils from across our schools have come together on this day.

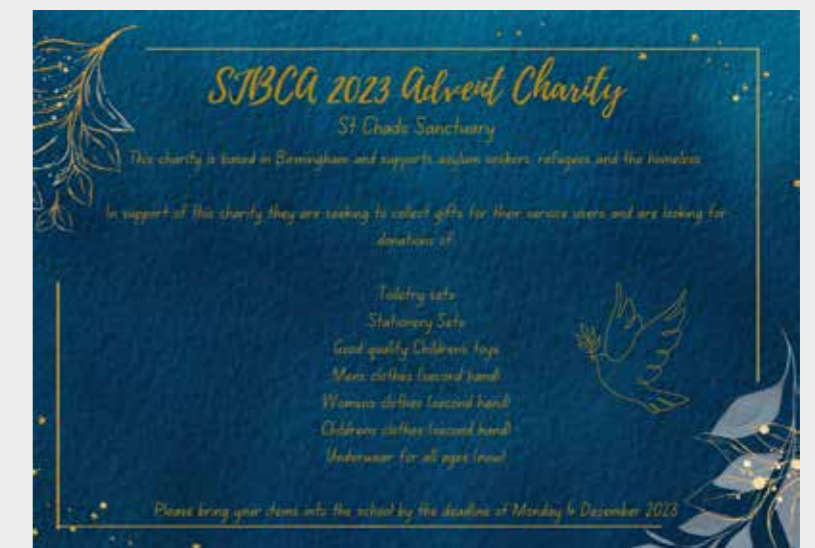


Advent Charity: St Chad's Sanctuary

St Chad's Sanctuary is a place of welcome for asylum Seekers and refugees in the heart of Birmingham. St Chad's Sanctuary makes people welcome through the provision of practical support, English classes and signposting.

All of our schools collected the following items to support people who access the sanctuary for help:

- Men's clothing in all sizes - coats, t-shirts, joggers, jeans, jumpers, hoodies and trainers
- ALL HYGIENE ITEMS - especially shaving foam/gel; deodorant
- Backpacks
- Suitcases
- Girls clothes, especially teenage sizes
- Boys clothes, especially teenage sizes
- ALL FOOD ITEMS - tinned, dried, non-meat containing
- Christmas gifts such as toiletry gift sets, hats, gloves, scarves, stationery sets

Governance Successes...

- 4 Directors were recruited to the Board of Directors in 2023/2024 with expertise in business management, governance, HR and School Improvement.
- 11 of 13 Chairs and Vice Chairs were enrolled on the NGA Chair's Development Course.
- The newly launched scheme of delegation was embedded and a move to incorporate focus meetings into the governance calendar evidenced greater challenge of school improvement in our schools.
- Following the separation of our Dudley Regional Board in 2022, the Local Governing Boards for St Chad's and St Joseph's have strengthened, with dedicated volunteers in post embracing their role as critical friends to the schools. Similarly, the Secondary School Board overseeing Stuart Bathurst Catholic High School and Bishop Milner Catholic College is secure in numbers and leadership and supported both schools in achieving positive Ofsted judgements this year.
- We have vacancies at St Marys, St John Bosco and St Bernadettes if you are interested in taking up a voluntary role.

We now have consistently strong and inspiring leadership teams which are delivering a clear strategic vision for our schools and clear direction for our staff. This is evident in the introduction of a cohesive People Strategy to support the development and wellbeing of all staff as they, in turn, support and nurture the diverse needs of all our pupils and students.

Performance-wise our investment in school improvement has played dividends. This last year we had three Ofsted inspections, with Bishop Milner (secondary) retaining its 'good' classification, while both St Bernadette's (primary) and Stuart Bathurst (secondary) improved on their previous inspections to secure a 'good' grading. While, St John Bosco and St Mark's primary schools were both rated as 'outstanding' in their Catholic School Inspections and Bishop Milner achieved an overall 'good' grading. I am well aware securing these outcomes is not easy. It is a testament to the hard work and commitment of the staff and well-motivated pupils in our schools to build on their strengths and continuously develop.

As a devoted Catholic one of the highlights was the visit of Bishop Bernard Longley to help celebrate our MAC day. For me, this helped cement the high regard and importance with which our catholic schools and wider community are held.

As a Board, we are now in our best position in terms of strength, diversity, capability, and experience to support the senior leaders and staff across our community of schools to face the challenges ahead. This will be essential as we work in collaboration with the Birmingham Diocese Education Service in creating the first of their Catholic Multi-academy Trusts to secure the future of Catholic education.

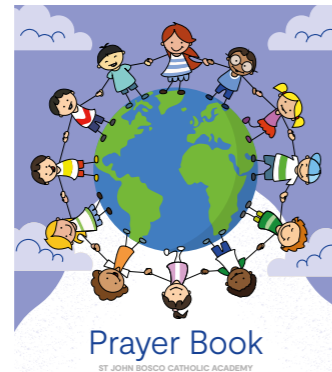

100% of the students surveyed agreed that the summit helped them to better understand what was happening in their local communities and around the world.

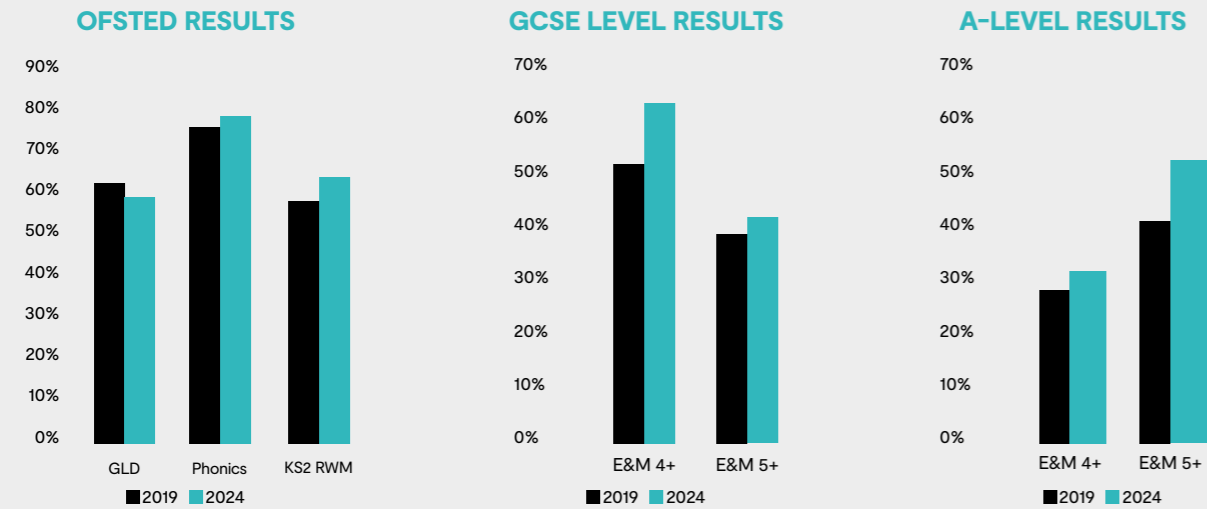

The MAC Journey this year...

SCHOOL DEVELOPMENT

- Bishop Milner Catholic College continued to be a 'Good' school following an Ofsted visit.
- Stuart Bathurst Catholic High School made incredible progress in their Ofsted inspection achieving a 'Good' outcome for the first time in 14 years!
- St Bernadette's Catholic Primary School achieved a 'Good' outcome in its Ofsted inspection.
- St Marks received Outstanding in all areas for its Catholic Schools Inspection (CSI).
- St Chad's also received Outstanding in all areas of their CSI.
- St John Bosco also received Outstanding in all areas of their CSI.
- Bishop Milner Catholic College achieved Good overall with Outstanding in two areas for their CSI.

Outcomes for pupils have continued to rise, with fantastic results in Phonics, Key Stage 2 and GCSEs which continue to improve on pre-pandemic results.



Our schools all now have alternative teaching spaces set up to support children with varied needs. These new spaces are truly inclusive and provide nurture to those who access the provision.

- Increased engagement of staff and pupils across all schools through events and shared activities.
- Appointment of MAC Leads for Maths and Faith Life to support improvement across all schools through a shared vision and common goals.
- Introduction of new forums for safeguarding and Special Educational Needs.
- Opportunities for pupils developed by schools including gymnastics and football competitions.

EFFECTIVE LEADERSHIP AND GOVERNANCE

- 6 new school leaders appointed.
- 3 recruited through internal promotion.
- Aspiring Leaders course attended by over 20 future leaders.
- Our external review of governance took place in Autumn of 2023. Amongst the key strengths;
- Our vision and strategic direction to further strengthen our commitment to Catholic life and mission was evident in all aspects of governance, affirmed by good and outstanding Catholic Schools Inspections.
- The oversight of the financial performance is particularly strong in St John Bosco Catholic Academy.
- The MAC enjoys strong professional relationships at all levels of governance and leadership. Whilst this can be challenging on occasions, there is an exceptionally strong collective drive to provide high quality educational opportunities for the pupils in all key stages.

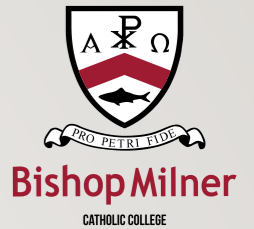

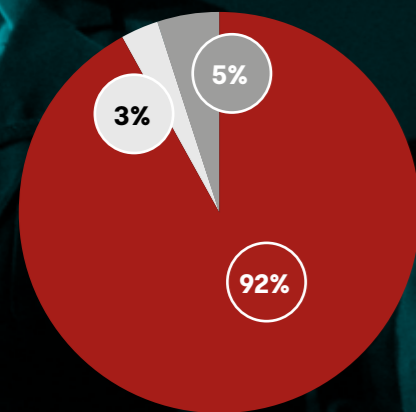
Financial Overview 2023/24

In 2023/24 the MAC has committed to spending and allocating resources to meet the objectives of each school and to ensure the children in our care are safe.

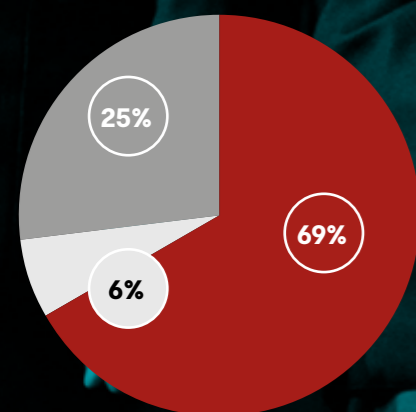
